Homeless Prevention & Rapid Re-Housing

What is HPRP?

HPRP is a federally funded program through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. The goal of the program is to stimulate the economy through preventing and eliminating homelessness at a local level.

Who is eligible for HPRP funds?

Homeless Prevention Applicants

- a. Applicant must have an income that will allow them to sustain housing.
 - a. Applicant must provide documentation of income for the last 30 days.
- b. Applicant must have a copy of their lease.
- c. Applicant must have a copy of 3/30 day notice to pay or quit.

Rapid Re-Housing Applicants

- a. Applicant must have income that will allow them to sustain housing
 - a. Applicant must provide documentation of income for the last 30 days.
- b. Applicant must be homeless, according to HUD guidelines.

Referral Process

- a. Applicants for Rapid-Re-housing services may self-refer by calling the HPRP Hotline, 650-458-2726.
- b. Applicants for Homeless Prevention may visit their local CORE Agency.
- c. Homeless applicants residing in shelter programs may be referred by their Case Manager by following the process outlined below.
 - 1. Case Manager identifies a possible HPRP candidate
 - 2. Case Manager fills out the HPRP Assessment Request form and the HUD Homeless Certification form.
 - 3. Case Manager faxes these two forms to Jacob Lile, HPRP Director at 650 994 5525.
 - 4. Applicant will be assigned an HPRP Case Manager who will contact them to schedule an assessment within two business days.
